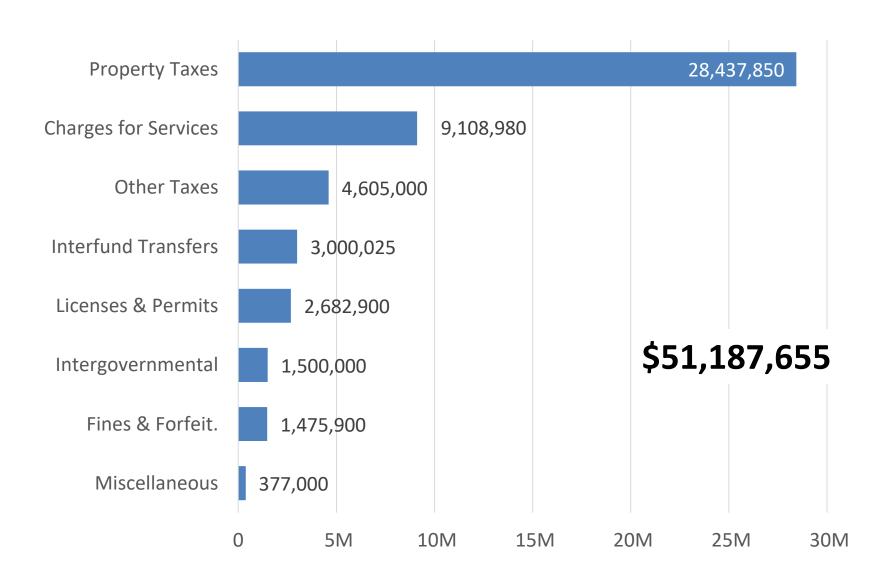

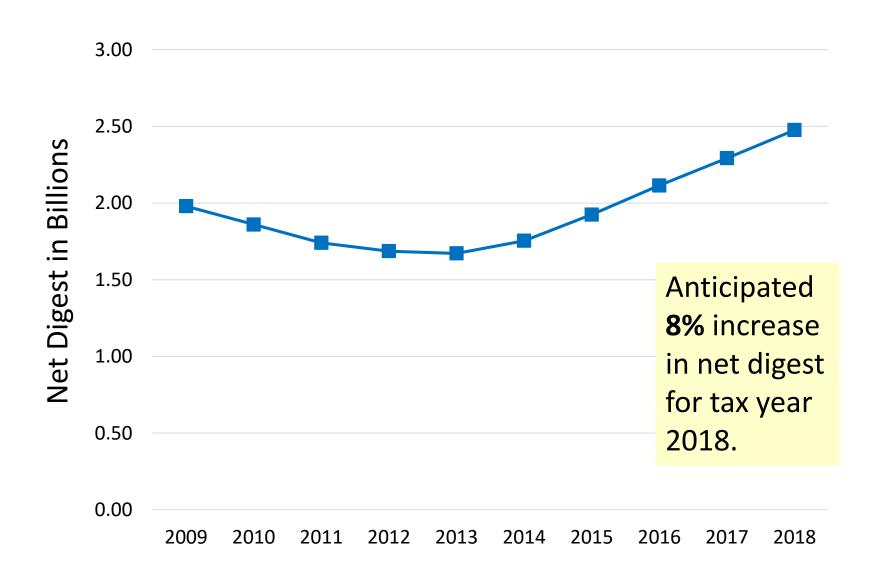

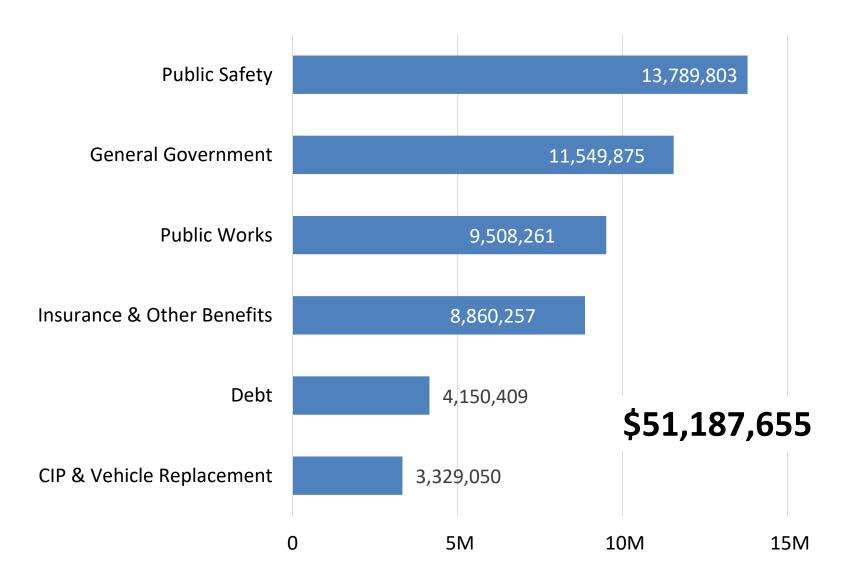
### General Fund Revenues

## **Debt Obligations**

- \$55,001,785 total outstanding bond debt
  - 2010 Series Revenue Bonds paid off in FY18
- \$4,271,742 scheduled for FY19
  - \$3,934,204 from the General Fund
  - \$237,538 from TAVT (interest on 2016 Series)
  - \$100,000 from funds previously committed
- \$142,878 capital lease payments for FY19
  - Last payment on capital lease for Fire Ladder Truck

## Other Personnel Requests Recommended

- 8 Position Reclassifications
  - \$50K budget impact
  - Conversion of 1 part-time position to full-time
- Class and Compensation Study performed in FY18
  - 70 FT salaries increased to new minimums
  - 1% increase to employees
  - \$283K budget impact
- New recruitment and retention incentives
  - \$84K budget impact for longevity
  - \$32K for retention bonuses

## Other Highlights

GF expenditures increased \$3.38M (7.1%)

- \$5.1M Health Insurance
  - \$358K (7.5%) increase including 11 new positions
  - Managing costs by decreasing employer contribution annually

 Excluding GF transfers and Employee Benefits, operations increasing 2% over FY 2018

# Other Highlights

- \$100K Transit Feasibility Study
  - Matching grant to leverage \$400K in federal funds
- Parks Maintenance assuming the mowing and general maintenance of Smyrna athletic fields
  - Decrease in costs from \$121K to \$102K

\$225K Museum Renovation

## Other Highlights

- \$25K Annexation Study
  - To inform and prioritize annexation strategies

- \$25K Organizational Analysis
  - To review employee job functions

- \$36K Preservation of Cemeteries
  - Daniell Cemetery and Zion Cemetery

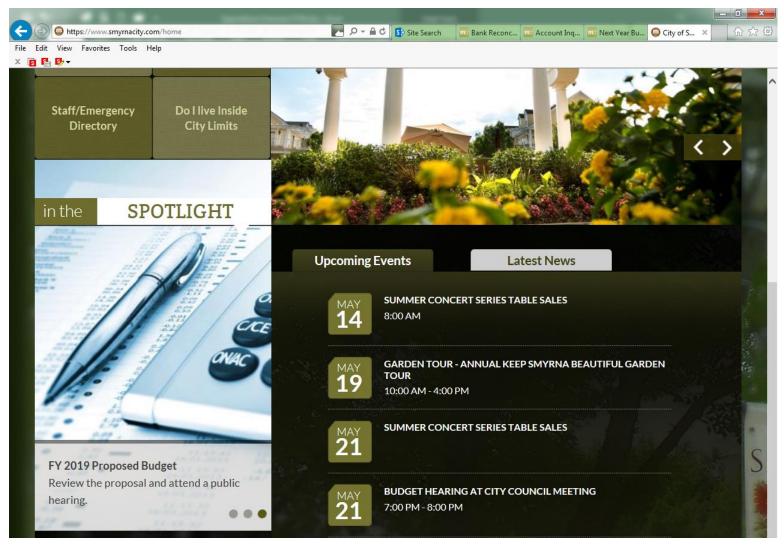
