Mayor Max Bacon called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Ms. Saddler – Jones spoke about the update board in the back hall and asked that Council update their vacation days for the Department Head calendar.

She also shared some updates in regards to the job trailer for Fire Station #2 being delivered to the new site and there will be banners posted at both locations to notify citizens. Mayor Bacon spoke about an outbuilding being delivered also to the location that is not very attractive and he inquired as to what the use of the building is for. Mr. Stokes spoke about the reasoning for the location of the shed in regards to callouts and getting onto the truck.

Ms. Saddler-Jones also informed the Council about fire-fighter Joe Paul's wife Lori and her recent passing. Mayor Bacon gave additional details regarding the illness.

Mr. Garland was stung by a hornet earlier today while inspecting and walking North Cooper Lake Park.

For GMA Councilmember Wilkinson will carry the flag and serve as the voting delegate.

AGENDA REVIEW:

Councilmember Doug Stoner remarked that he would request to table South Cobb Drive Improvement Study to the next agenda on June 19, 2017. He and Councilmember Wilkinson had spoken about the study that there were some demographic errors and typos. She would like the document to be corrected.

Mayor Bacon spoke about the H.A.W.K. signal crossing on South Cobb Drive. Mr. Cochran said that they got a little bit ahead of themselves and would have to get with DOT. The DOT has already

started the project they are closer to Plaza Drive than they thought they were supposed to be. Mayor Bacon has serious concerns about the jaywalkers on South Cobb Drive.

Sanitary Sewer at Pretty Branch will be voted on. This is a \$325,000 project.

The last public hearing for the budget will be held tonight and a short presentation with the final updates and recommendations will be given by Budget Manager Jered Sigmon. They will also discuss the vehicle replacement fund.

Councilmember Teri Anulewicz got a tour of the new Wade's restaurant and it is very close to being completed with an expected opening date of July 20th.

Councilmember Fennel spoke about the Smyrna Sharks progress and accomplishments.
