1. Introductions & Update – Mayor John Ernst

Since our June 25 meeting, ATL Link and MARTA have worked with Committee staff to bring planning documents forward to meet the Top End Phase III study requirements and leverage the MARTA study already underway. The resulting partnership will deliver two plans that are tightly coordinated to address Committee Members' initiatives, meet MARTA's technical requirements for stations, and meet GDOT and legislative timelines. This phase of the Top End Transit planning brings together an unprecedented level of interagency and municipal leadership cooperation. We will be having detailed presentations on planning logistics at today's meeting.

Recognizing the importance of coordination with County Transit Planning the Committee will start with an update on the DeKalb Transit Plan delivered by CEO Michael Thurmond.
